#### Outcomes for the Month:

 Ann Hepfer has prepared and sent the Abstinence Grant renewal application to MDCH for review. We have applied to the United Way for \$10,000 through a mini-grant application to assist clients in applying for state benefits such as food stamps, housing, and Medicaid.

#### Issues under consideration by the Local Health Department:

- Dr. Bush and Ann worked on a case investigation for Hepatitis A with MDCH. It
  was rather involved and ended up with 86 people as contacts all out of our
  county. No cases of additional infection occurred related to the index case.
- Five dog bite investigations, two cat bite investigations, two bats sent to MDCH
  for rabies testing with negative results, and two raccoon investigations one
  resulted in the head being sent to MDCH but was not testable so the person was
  started on rabies treatment and the second one raccoon tested negative.
- The Family Planning Program underwent a federal audit on July 17<sup>th</sup> as part of the State's audit. The auditors found very few things and stated our Family Planning was exemplary.
- Not having Medical Examiner Secretarial support on Mondays is still creating some difficulties.

A regular meeting of the Board was held in their offices at 1733 S. Mertz Rd., Caro, Michigan on Thursday, August 1, 2013 at 8:00 A.M.

Present: Road Commissioners John Laurie, Gary Parsell, Mike Zwerk, Julie Matuszak, and Pat Sheridan; County Highway Engineer Michele Zawerucha, Superintendent/Manager Jay Tuckey, Director of Finance/Secretary-Clerk Michael Tuckey.

Motion by Parsell seconded by Matuszak that the minutes of the July 18, 2013 regular meeting of the Board be approved. Sheridan, Matuszak, Zwerk, Parsell, Laurie --- Carried.

Payroll in the amount of \$91,376.19 and bills in the amount of \$531,538.96 covered by vouchers #13-23, #13-24, and #13-25 were presented and audited.

Motion by Zwerk seconded by Sheridan that the payroll and bills be approved. Sheridan, Matuszak, Zwerk, Parsell, Laurie --- Carried.

Brief Public Comment Segment:

- (1) Almer Township Supervisor Jim Miklovic asked the Board about the Michigan Department of Transportation's request for a detour route including Dickerson Road at the last regular meeting of the Board. Chairman Laurie reported that MDOT will not be using a detour route during the M-25 road construction project.
- (2) Watertown Township Trustee Frank Worvie asked the Board about the road grading schedule in Watertown Township. Superintendent/Manager Jay Tuckey explained the Road Commission's road grading policy and procedure. Mr. Worvie also reported to the Board of receiving complaints regarding the intersection of Brown Road and Fostoria Road. County Highway Engineer Zawerucha reported the recent work and sign changes at that intersection. The Board recommended that any additional signs must be requested from the Watertown Township Board.

Motion by Parsell seconded by Zwerk that the following Resolution be adopted:

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Tuscola County Board of Road Commissioners has entered into a Road Agreement with NextEra Energy Resources for the Tuscola Wind II Turbine Project in the Townships of Fairgrove, Gilford, Akron, and Wisner, and

WHEREAS, NextEra Energy Resources and G.E. Energy will be contracting various trucking companies to ransport the wind turbine components into Tuscola County, and

WHEREAS, The Tuscola County Board of Road Commissioners considers this a "Special Project" and that he transported wind turbine components are defined as a "Super Load", thus requiring a variance of the Road Commission's normal blanket permit procedures, and

WHEREAS, these various contracted trucking companies will be transporting the wind turbine components at rate of eight (8) oversize/overweight "Super Loads" for each of the fifty-nine (59) wind turbines to be installed in he Townships of Fairgrove, Gilford, Akron, and Wisner, and

WHEREAS, The Tuscola County Board of Road Commissioners desires to streamline the permitting process luring this "Special Project" and in order to be consistent with the fees and procedures of other County Road Commissions and the Michigan Department of Transportation regarding projects with "Super Loads".

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Tuscola County Board of Road Commissioners grants a variance of the Road Commission's normal permitting procedures and will allow faxed permit applications from the various contracted trucking companies for the designated hauling route on a daily basis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tuscola County Road Commission establishes a permit fee of \$25.00 or each transported "Super Load" during this "Special Project" and will invoice the permit fees to the various ontracted trucking companies on a weekly basis.

Sheridan, Matuszak, Zwerk, Parsell, Laurie --- Carried.

County Highway Engineer Zawerucha presented to the Board a request from NextEra Energy Resources and Atwell, LLC to use the Tuscola County Road Commission as the permitting authority for the crane crossings on M-138 during the Tuscola Wind II Project. Mr. Dave Newlin with Blattner Energy explained MDOT's permitting policy and the plans for the crane crossings during the project. After further discussion, the following motion was introduced:

Motion by Parsell seconded by Matuszak to approve an agreement between the Tuscola County Road Commission and Blattner Energy to use the Tuscola County Road Commission as the permitting authority for the crane crossings on M-138 during the Tuscola Wind II Project, all pending a legal review by the Road Commission's attorney. Sheridan, Matuszak, Zwerk, Parsell, Laurie --- Carried.

The Board read a letter from the Tuscola County Central Dispatch thanking the Road Commission for assistance during a severe thunderstorm on July 19, 2013.

At 8:30 A.M. the following bids were opened for Grader Blades (Item A - 3/4" x 8" x 6' single bevel curved, through hardened; Item B - 3/4" x 8" x 7' single bevel curved, through hardened:

Motion by Zwerk seconded by Parsell that the bids for Grader Blades be accepted, reviewed by Management, and tabled until the next regular meeting of the Board. Sheridan, Matuszak, Zwerk, Parsell, Laurie --- Carried.

Management and the Board further discussed the water drainage and a driveway culvert installation on North Grove Road. County Highway Engineer Zawerucha presented to the Board a letter to Mr. Joe Gerulis regarding her review of the location. After discussion, the Board agrees with the engineering review and considers the issue resolved.

Motion by Sheridan seconded by Parsell to approve the promotion of Paul Hawley and Marc Southworth from the Laborer job classification to the Light Equipment Operator job classification, as recommended by the Superintendent/Manager. Sheridan, Matuszak, Zwerk, Parsell, Laurie --- Carried.

Superintendent/Manager Jay Tuckey presented to the Board a letter from the Teamsters Union requesting that the Highway Maintenance Foreman position be included in the Tuscola County Road Commission Hourly Employees Association. Tuckey explained that the position includes all the duties from the old State Highway Foreman position, and that the position is considered supervisory. After further discussion, the following motion was introduced:

Motion by Sheridan seconded by Zwerk to deny the request from the Teamsters Union to include the Highway Maintenance Foreman position in the Tuscola County Road Commission Hourly Employees Association, and that the position is considered supervisory. Sheridan, Matuszak, Zwerk, Parsell, Laurie --- Carried.

Motion by Parsell seconded by Sheridan that the agreement between Michigan Aggregate Products, LLC and the Tuscola County Road Commission allowing Designated and Special Designated All-Season loads on Snover Road from its establishment east to Leix Road be extended for two (2) years with the conditions specified in the agreement. Sheridan, Matuszak, Zwerk, Parsell, Laurie --- Carried.

Motion by Sheridan seconded by Parsell to approve the request from the Cass River Greenway Trail Committee for the Road Commission's continued participation in the control of phragmites along the road right-of-ways draining into the Cass River, at a maximum expense of \$2,500.00.
