- 1. Contractor shall be responsible for any needed permits or plans.
- 2. Contractor shall field verify measurements.
- 3. Pad will be located behind building at the rear garage entrance.
- 4. New slab is for a new 10x20 shed.
- 5. New slab shall be 4 inches thick with wire.
- 6. Contractor shall remove topsoil.
- 7. If existing soil provides a good base, then slab may be installed. However, if required for a solid base, contractor shall excavate and provide a minimum of a 6-inch base of compacted crushed gravel.
- 8. New pad shall be installed to shed water away from main building.
- 9. Pad shall have a broom finish.
- 10. Contractor shall back fill around pad, repair damaged or disturbed lawn, and reseed.
- 11. Contractor shall be responsible for daily clean up of jobsite.

Contract shall provide proof of liability and workmen's comp insurance. Before work begins.
