RE: Parking Lot Expansion

Tuscola County will be accepting bids on a Parking Lot Expansion for the County Animal Shelter. The following specifications shall be considered in your bid:

Location:

Tuscola County Animal Shelter 2738 W. Caro RD Caro, MI 48723

The County is looking to add additional parking for employees. The expansion will be about 2500 square feet.

Contractor Shall:

- 1. Verify gradients and elevations.
- 2. Strip topsoil and vegetation. Do not excavate wet or frozen material. Stockpile topsoil in an area on site.
- 3. Remove subsoil from site as required for new base, binder, and wearing courses.
- 4. Proof roll with a loaded tandem axle truck to verify compacted subbase is dry and ready to support paving and imposed loads.
- 5. Apply primer on aggregate base and subbase at a uniform rate of 1/3 gallon per square yard.
- 6. Use clean sand to blot excess primer.
- 7. Apply tack coat on asphalt surfaces over subgrade surface at uniform rate of 1/3 gallon per square yard.
- 8. Place asphalt binder course within 24 hours of applying primer.
- 9. Place binder course to compacted thickness.
- 10.Place wearing course within 24 hours of placing and compacting binder course. When binder course is placed more than 24 hours before placing wearing course, clean surface and apply a tack coat before placing wearing course.
- 11. Place wearing course to compacted thickness.
- 12. Compact each course by rolling to specified density. Do not displace or extrude pavement from position. Hand compact in areas inaccessible to rolling equipment.
- 13.Perform rolling with consecutive passes to achieve even and smooth finish without roller marks.
- 14.Leave stockpile area clean, raked, and ready to receive seeding. Seeding and mulching by owner.

15.Flatness: Maximum variation of ¼ inch measured with 10-foot straight edge.

16. Schedule Compacted Thickness: Within ¼ inch

Accepted Materials:

- 1. Aggregate for Base Course:100% crushed limestone meeting 22A and free of shale, frost susceptibility, clay, friable material, sand and debris equal to stone mix. Local material that has been acceptable to MDOT is acceptable. Thickness 8 inches compacted.
- 2. Aggregate for Binder Course Mix: In accordance with State of Michigan Department of Transportation latest standards. Bituminous mix 13A performance grade 64-22. Thickness 2.0 inch, compacted.
- 3. Aggregate for Wearing Course Mix: In accordance with State of Michigan Department of Transportation latest standards. Bituminous mix 13A performance grade 64-22. Thickness 1.5 inch, compacted
- 4. Primer/Tack Coat: Homogenous, medium curing liquid asphalt, in accordance with Michigan Department of Transportation.

Other:

- 1. Contractor shall provide Liability and Workmen Comp insurance.
- 2. Contractor shall provide all necessary tools and equipment.
- Contractor while on jobsite shall work in a manner not to hinder the Shelter operation as much as possible and to allow public access to the current parking lot and building.
- 4. Qualified personnel shall perform all work.
