## Resolution Honoring Mark Zmierski 2025 - 07

**Whereas**, Mark Zmierski is retiring from the Tuscola County Veterans Affairs Office after providing 10 years of dedicated service to the Tuscola County Veterans; and

**Whereas**, Mark was born and raised in Cass City, graduating from Cass City High School in 1980 then started his active duty with the US Navy in August of 1980 and was honorably discharged from the US Navy in 1984. In August of 1988 Mark was recalled to active duty in the Navy until his retirement on September 30, 2006, as a Senior Chief; and

**Whereas**, In October 1987 Mark started as a Veterans Service Officer until recalled to active duty in the US Navy in August of 1988. In the spring of 2007, Mark graduated from Exceisor College with a bachelor's degree in business management. Mark worked for the Village of Cass City as the Code Enforcement Officer from 2006-2008 and for the Rail America Railroad as a Logistics Support Specialist from 2008-2015; and

**Whereas**, Mark started as a Veterans Service Officer at Tuscola County Veterans Affairs in May of 2015 until promoted to Director of Tuscola County Veterans Affairs on October 1, 2015. After a Veterans millage was generously passed by Tuscola County voters in 2015 which started in January of 2016; and

**Whereas**, Mark has helped grow the County's Veterans office to 3 full-time employees. He has increased the number of Veterans signed up in Tuscola County for VA healthcare from 20% to 44%; and

**Whereas**, Mark has worked with the Caro American Legion Post 7 in planning three 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Vietnam War Commemorations, recognized the 20 Vietnam War Gold Star families and also is helping to bring the Moving Wall back to Caro at the end of June 2025; and

**Whereas**, Mark has helped expand the number of volunteer drivers to transport over 40 of our aging Veterans to their monthly VA medical appointments. Along with the VA, also has started issuing the US Veteran flag holders and the 12x18 American flags to the townships across the county. Annually, there are over 8,000 flags issued for placement in the US Veterans flag holders in our cemeteries.; and

**Whereas**, Mark is the co-founder of the Vet2Vet group which gathers monthly in Mayville at the Veterans You are Not Forgotten Pavilion. Mark has been formally recognized as being the best director of a county Veterans Affairs Office in Michigan; and

**Therefore, Be It Resolved**, that on behalf of the residents of Tuscola County, and the Tuscola County Board of Commissioners, we take this opportunity to commend Mark Zmierski for his tremendous contributions and for so profoundly improving the quality of life for so many Veterans of our county while contributing to the prosperity of our county during his many years of valuable service to Tuscola County and we wish Mark many enjoyable years of retirement.

**A RESOLUTION TO RECOGNIZE THE MONTH OF MAY 2025 AS JEWISH  
HERITAGE MONTH IN GENESEE COUNTY**

**WHEREAS**, the United States and individual states across the nation, including Michigan, have recognized Jewish Heritage in May, starting with President Jimmy Carter's recognition of Jewish American Heritage Week in 1980 that was broadened to proclaiming May as Jewish American Heritage Month by President George W. Bush in 2006, which recognized the contributions Jewish people have made to American culture over the last 350 years; and

**WHEREAS**, the Jewish community in Genesee County has offered social services for people of all races, religions, and nationalities through the Flint Jewish Federation's congregate meal, mobile meal, immigration, and referral service programs, as well as facilitated transportation to medical appointments and grocery shopping; and

**WHEREAS**, the Flint Jewish Federation has also organized annual opportunities for members of the local community to celebrate Jewish culture and build connections across cultures through the Karen Schneider Flint Jewish Film Festival, Daniel Pearl World Music Days Humanity in Harmony concert, Don Riegle Community Service Awards, and support of Martin Luther King, Jr. tribute activities and has also worked to deepen understanding of Jewish history through annual Holocaust Commemoration and to deepen relationships between groups of Jews and people of color through activities such as joint visits to the Zekelman Holocaust Museum and Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History; and

**WHEREAS**, local Jewish people are notable volunteers, donors, and supporters of numerous cultural, educational, social justice, and business institutions in Genesee County including but not limited to the Flint Institute of Arts, Flint Institute of Music, Sloan/Longway, Food Bank of Eastern Michigan, Crim Fitness Foundation, Gloria Coles Flint Public Library, and Flint Children's Museum; and

**WHEREAS**, Jewish people in Genesee County have been actively involved in combatting bigotry and discrimination in all forms, including working to end racial housing discrimination practices, secure voting rights for all, and helping to resettle refugees escaping oppression in other countries, including David Miller who coordinated the resettlement and acculturation of over 450 refugees from the former Soviet Union and 43 Russian Muslim Turkish

families and Robert Segar, an attorney who successfully argued the Virginia Poll Tax case before the US Supreme Court in 1966, which found that poll taxes in state elections were unconstitutional, and Steven C. Low whose steadfast leadership as the Executive Director of the Flint Jewish Federation has animated the rich legacy of Jewish families in Genesee County
