Adoption Process Information:

- The Adoption process will take at least 6 months to be completed.
- The case will be referred for an investigation by the Tuscola County Juvenile Probation Office.
- Part of the investigation includes four letters of references. Individuals who are identified as providing a written
 letter of reference will have 14 days from the date of notification to provide the Juvenile Probation Office with
 the letter of reference. If the four letters are not received within the time frame requested, the investigation will
 not continue and the case may be dismissed.

Self-represented litigant information:

- If you are filing an adoption as a self-represented litigant, you must know how to properly complete the forms, and how to timely file the forms, without any assistance from the County Clerk's office.
- If the forms are not properly completed, the case will be closed without a refund. Further, if a biological parent is not willing to consent to an adoption, you must know how to proceed according to the law.
