Tuscola County will be accepting bids on the installation of Rolling Chain Link Driveway Gates at the Tuscola County Recycling Center 1123 Mertz Rd (M-24) Caro MI 48723. The following specifications shall be considered in your bid:

1. Contractor is to follow all local, State, and Federal building codes.
2. Contractor is responsible for any needed drawings and permits.
3. Contractor is responsible to remove existing gates.
4. Contractor is to install one 22 x 6 and one 18 x 6 cantilevered gates, on 3" schedule 40 roller posts.
5. Rollers are to be maintenance free nylon.
6. Gates shall be Heavy Duty Commercial grade welded frames with 9 gauge chain link.
7. Contractor is to install two 3" schedule 40 latch posts with lockable cantilever post latches.
8. Contractor shall be responsible for repairing any damage to the landscaping.
9. All work shall be performed by qualified personnel.
10. Contractor shall be insured and provides copies of Work comp. and Liability before work begins.

Closed sealed proposals shall be submitted to the Tuscola County Recycling Center at 1123 Mertz rd Caro Michigan 48723 no later than 4:30 pm on March 12th, 2012.
