**RE: Picnic Tables**

Tuscola County will be accepting bids on New Universal Design Picnic Tables at Vanderbilt Park. The following specifications shall be considered in your bid:

Location: 4446 Bath RD Fairgrove, MI 48733

1. Contractors bid will be based on a price per unit.
2. Tables shall be made of recyclable content such as but not limited to Plastic or Aluminum.
3. Tables shall be low maintenance, no painting or staining.
4. Tables shall be of Universal Design, so that they are available for use by anyone with limited mobility.
5. Tables are to have a minimum of one (1) wheel chair accessible space with the following requirements:
  - Knee clearance should allow a minimum of the following: 27 inches in height, 30 inches in width, and 11 inches in depth
  - Toe clearance should allow a minimum of the following: 9 inches in height, 30 inches in width and 17 inches in depth
  - Clear space for wheelchair seating is a minimum of 30 inches
6. Contractor shall include delivery of assembled tables to the park in their bid.

Contractor shall provide any needed permits to complete this project and must follow all local, State, and Federal construction codes.

Call Miss DIG (811) prior to any ground disturbance.

Contractor shall provide copies of liability and worker's comp insurance, before work can begin.

State Recreation Passport grant funding is being used for this project.

Only **Sealed** proposals labeled "Park Picnic Tables" shall be submitted to the Tuscola County Controllers office 125 W. Lincoln st, Caro, and MI 48723 no later than 4:00pm August 29, 2017.
