Tuscola County will be accepting bids on a new pre-built storage shed at the MSU Extension 362 Green Street, Caro MI 48723. The following specifications shall be considered in your bid:

1. New shed minimum size shall be 12x16
2. 8 foot minimum sidewalls
3. Gabled roof with 25 year shingles
4. 2x4 wall construction with primed T-111 siding or equivalent.
5. No windows
6. A minimum 6 foot wide roll up door
7. One 36 inch entry door
8. Minimum 2x4 treated floor joists 16" O.C. with ½ inch minimum treated flooring.
9. Minimum 5 year warranty on shed construction and siding and flooring
10. Color options to be provided by selected contractor
11. Delivery to our location, and placed in chosen site.
12. Please provide pricing for the following options:
 - Steel roofing
 - Steel siding

- Vinyl siding
- Gambrel style instead of Gable

Contract shall provide proof of liability and workmen's comp insurance. Before work begins.

Only qualified personnel shall be use to complete projects
