- 1. The vehicle shall be a regular cab work truck (extended cab would be considered) and include the following options as a minimum:
  - 1. 4x4
  - 2. ¾ ton
  - 3. Gas Engine
  - 4. All Terrain Tires
  - 5. Daytime Headlights
  - 6. No Carpet
  - 7. Full Size Spare Tire
  - 8. Trailer Towing package
  - 9. Spray in bedliner
  - 10. Driver/Passenger Front Air Bags
  - 11. Cloth Seating
  - 12. Hands free phone capability
  - 13. Running Boards
  - 14. 3 Sets of Keys
- 2. Dealers shall use municipal or State pricing for both options.
- 3. Options shall include all fees except for Plates.
- 4. Dealer is required to deliver the vehicle to the County.
