To say 2021 has been another challenging year is an understatement. We, like every other law enforcement agency and even other business have lost staff. Our deputies are among the best and they are often recruited by other agencies big and small. Also, a large part of losing staff has been retirement, another ongoing country wide issue. Keeping the same level of response in both the jail and road patrol is a testament to those working here. We are employing new tactics to actively recruit and retain quality employees. I will continue to protect and serve to the best of my ability with the resources I have available.

We continue to receive information on what it will take to replace the 1965 jail and Sheriff's Office. The longer we wait, the cost will continue to rise tremendously. Two years past the initial estimate the cost has gone up approximately 13 million dollars. I do not feel we want to pass an even bigger burden onto our children by waiting and waiting until something happens that forces us to get this aging building replaced.

As far as the calls responded to by our deputies, mental health issues are still high. Scams and fraud type calls continue, but hopefully we have put enough information out to the public by Facebook and through our TRIAD. Citizens are learning how to deal with these concerns. However, we do have some that lose thousands of unrecoverable dollars.

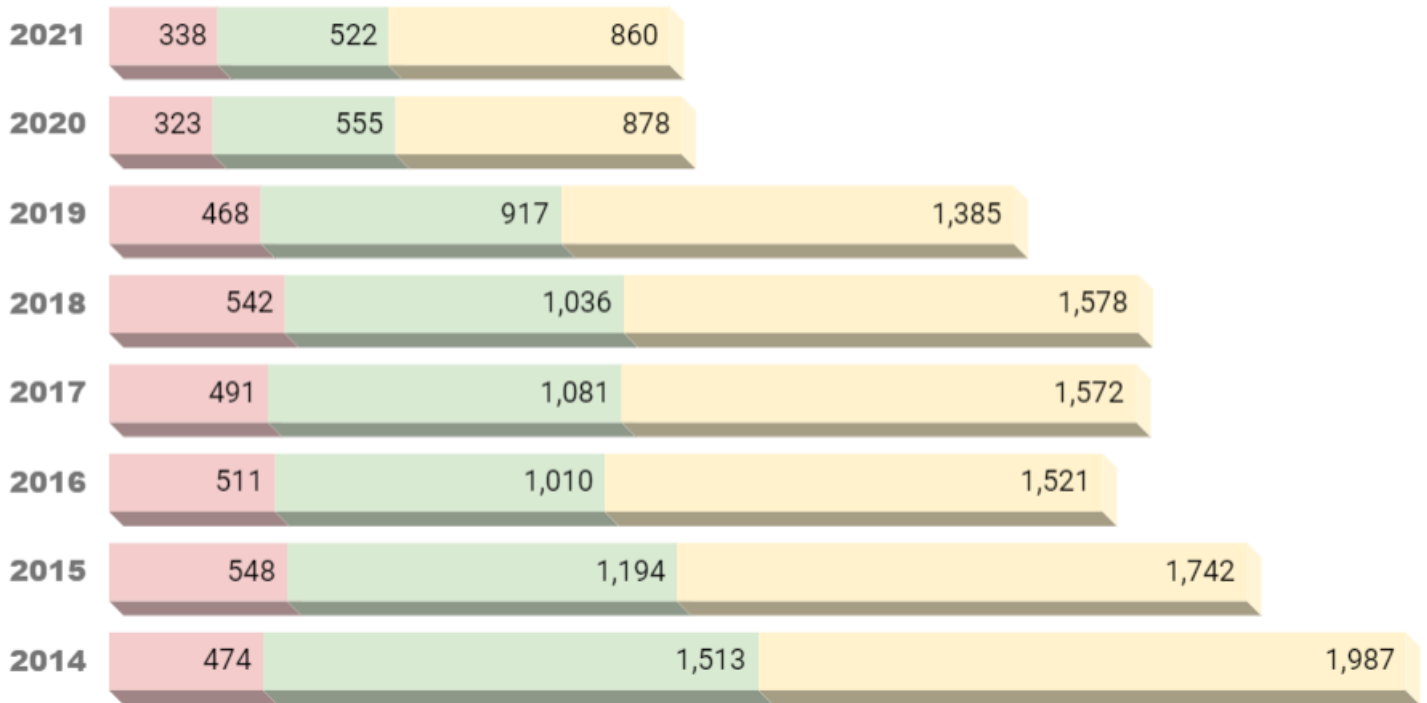

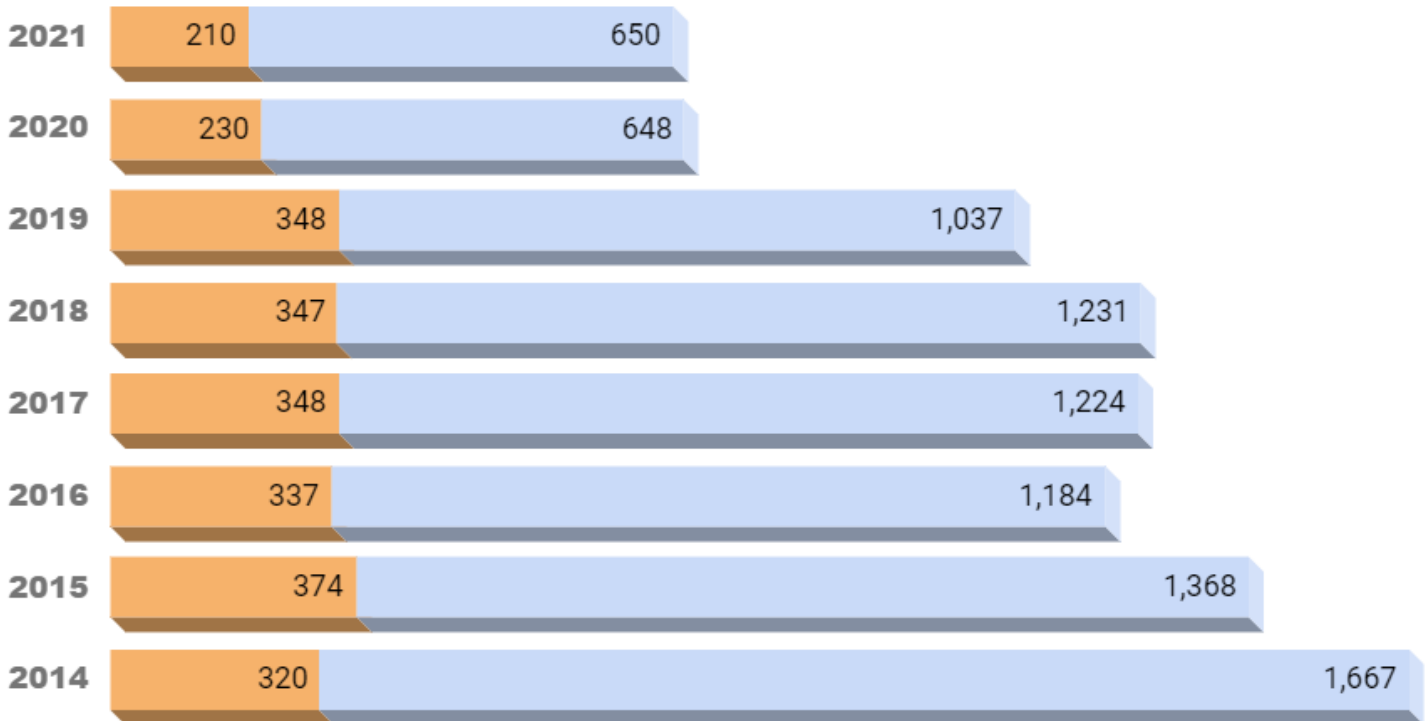
# LODGED COMPARISONS

■ **Total Persons Lodged**



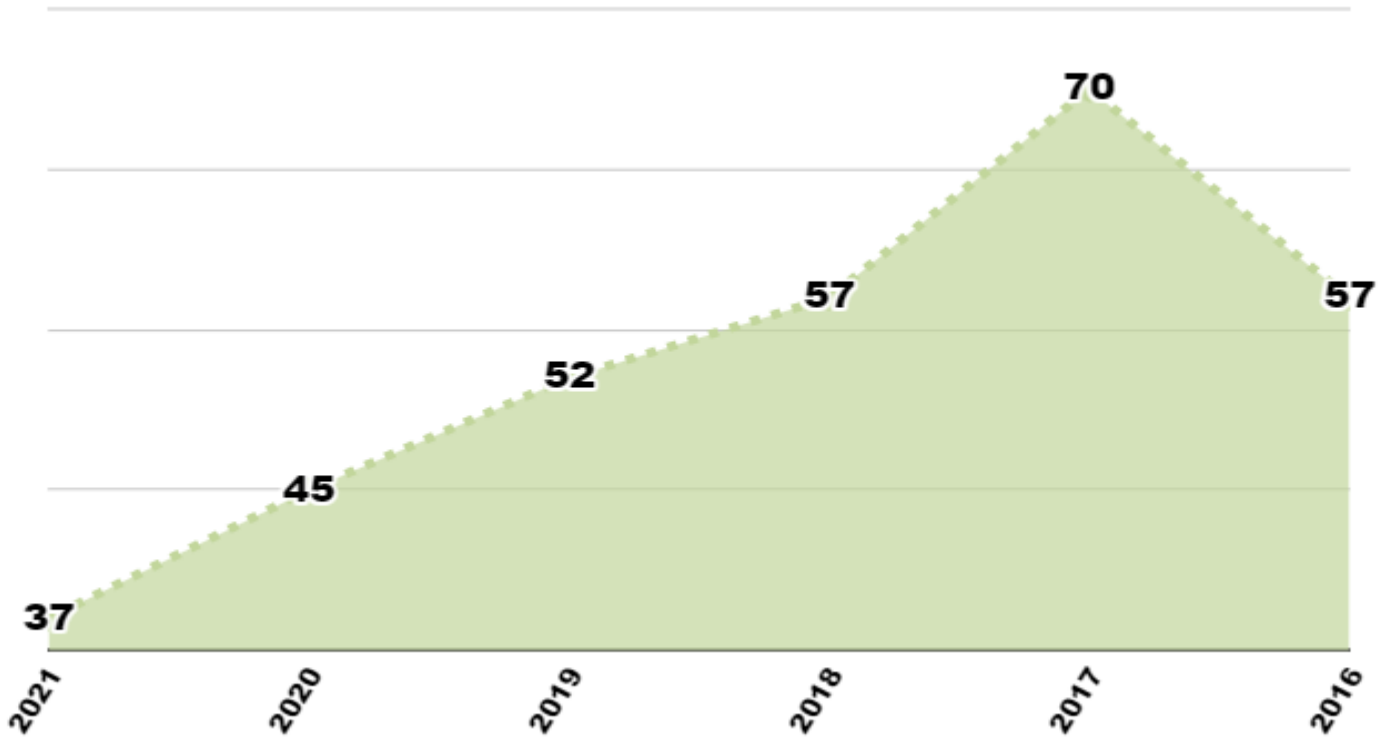

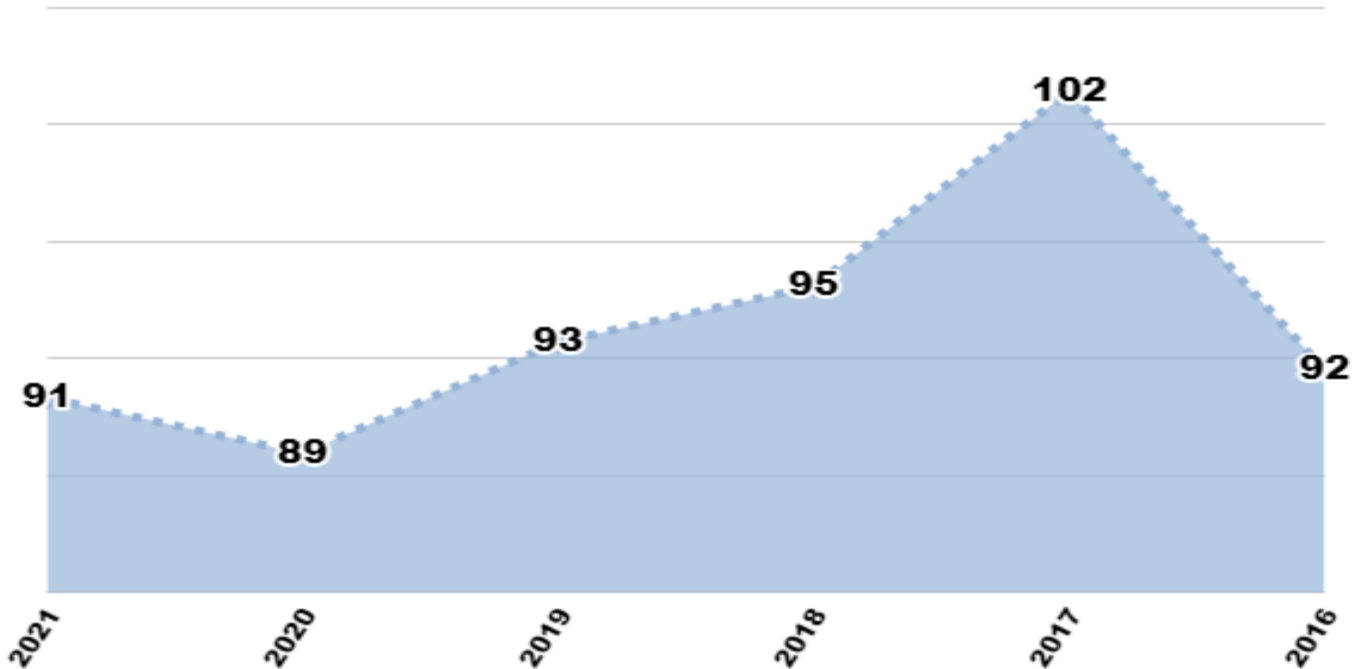

Inmates Transported to Department Of Corrections (Prison)



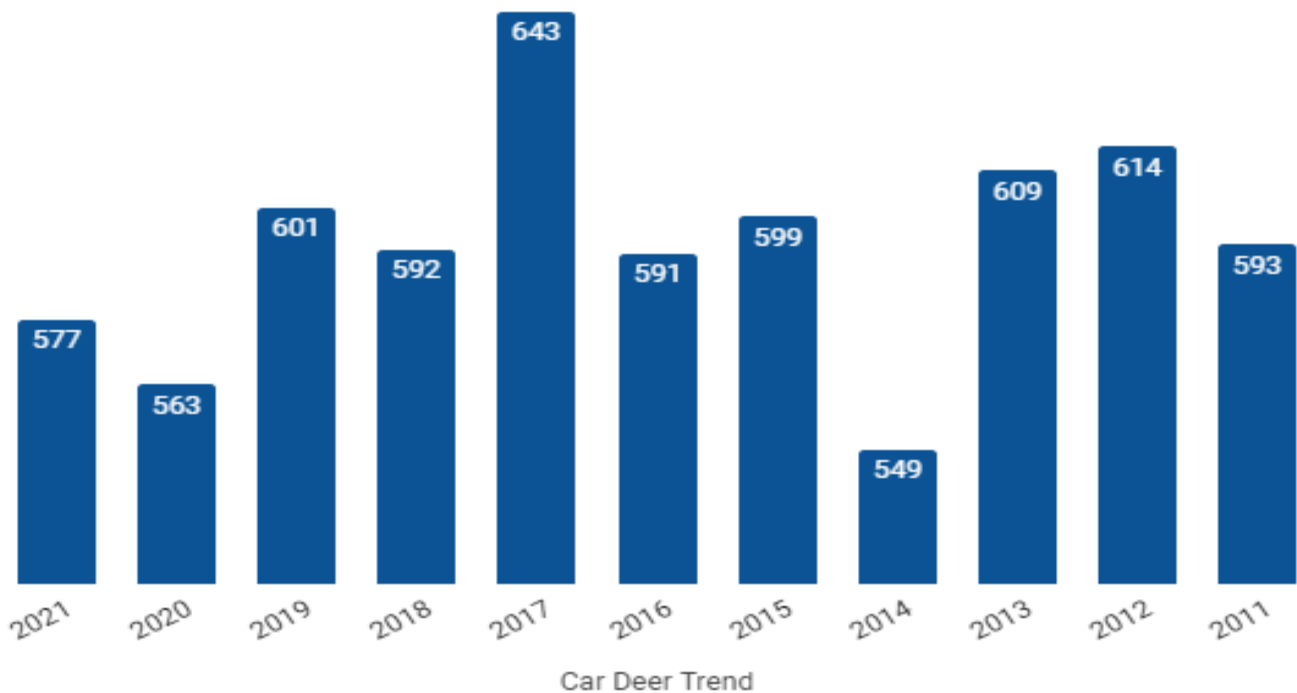

TRIAD had another tough year getting together for meetings due to Covid. One of the things we are finding successful when we do have a meeting is to go over a case and do a “case study”. The service groups on our committee take an actual case and see what the organizations can further do for the incident. It could be a scam case where a vulnerable adult continues to lose money to scammers or elderly at home being abused.

There are many amazing organizations in our county with many programs. We try to tie them all in together along with meetings that take place at the ISD involving the Human Services Collaboration Council.

Hopefully we can meet in person soon. We are looking for more seniors to join our TRIAD to become “Citizens at large” and help us assess senior needs, which is a growing population in our county.

# Victim Service's Unit

The Victim Service Coordinator is a VOCA grant funded position to assist and advocate for all Crime Victims with emphasis on Domestic and Sexual Assaults. The Coordinator assist with case notifications, Personal Protection Orders, support during interviews with Law Enforcement, and provide victims with support, information and referrals as needed. The Coordinator also oversees the Sheriff's Office Victim Service Unit. The Victim Service Unit is comprised entirely of community volunteers who are on call 24 hours a day/7days a week. They are utilized by local police agencies during traumatic events, where they assist and support victims and/or survivors of crimes and unexpected deaths.

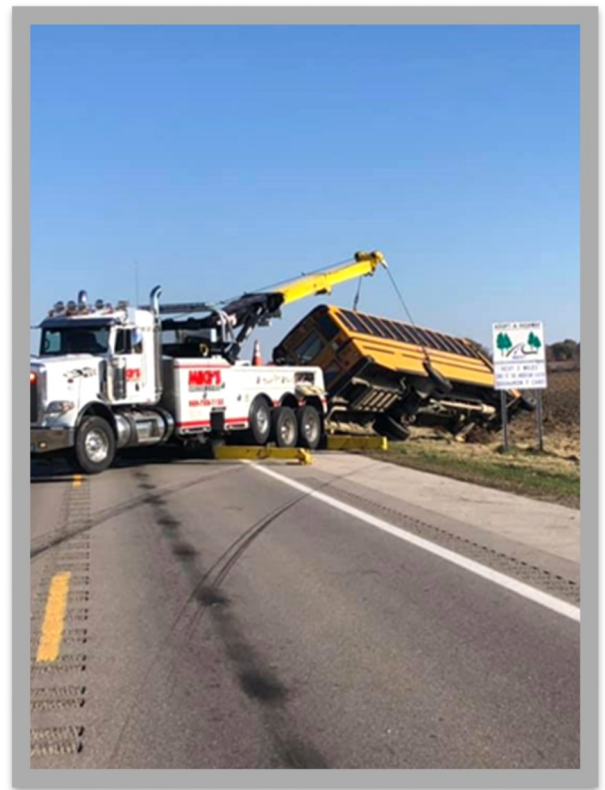

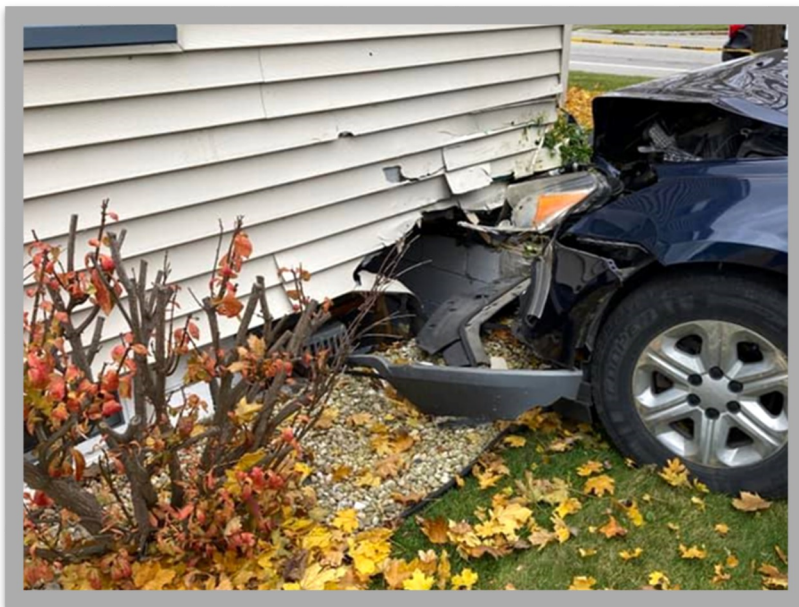

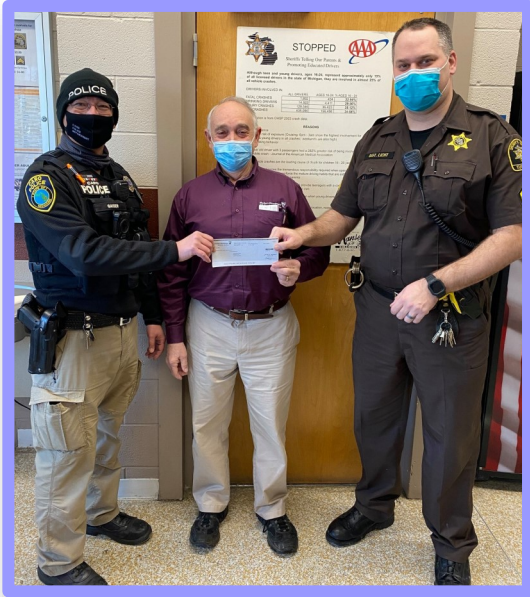
## Stuff a Humvee
